His grandfather, Peter (Weitzel) Whitesell, was a native German, and came to America in an early part of this century. He settled in Lincoln County, Tenn., and in 1828 removed to Weakley County (now Obion County), and died there about 1860. Our subject's father is a farmer and capitalist, and now resides at Fulton County, Ky. Robert P. Whitesell is the eldest of four children and was educated in the schools of Fulton County, Ky., and Clinton College. He entered the latter in 1875 and graduated in 1879. He then took a special course in the University of Virginia, and subsequently attended the law department of Vanderbilt University, from which he graduated in 1883. In the fall of the same year he was admitted to the Union City bar and formed a partnership with his brother-in-law, A. J. Harpole, and they together have a large clientage. He is a Democrat in politics and his first presidential vote was cast for Cleveland. He is a Knight of Pythias.

George B. Wilson, merchant, and clerk and master of the chancery court, was born in Livingston County, N. Y., April 2, 1838, son of W. J. and Mary (Garvin) Wilson, and is of Scotch-Irish origin. W. J. Wilson was born in Pennsylvania in 1806, and his wife in the Green Mountain State in 1808. She died in 1875. Samuel Wilson, our subject's paternal grandfather, was a Pennsylvanian. George B. Wilson was educated at Temple Hill Academy in Genesee, N. Y. In 1856 he went to St. Louis, Mo., and for one year was clerk in the district court clerk's office. In 1857 he came to Obion County, Tenn., and settled in Troy, where he was engaged in teaching school from 1857 to 1861. At the latter date he enlisted in Obion Avalanche Company, Ninth Tennessee Infantry, and served as private for four years. After the war he came back to Troy and continued to teach the "young idea" one year. In 1866 he engaged in general merchandising, and has since continued that business, having one of the most complete stocks of goods in Troy. He is a Democrat, and in 1875 was appointed clerk of the circuit court by Judge Hawkins to fill a vacancy. In 1876 he was appointed to his present position, which he is filling very efficiently. In 1867 Eliza G. Williamson, of Giles County, became his wife. She was born in 1850, is the mother of one child, Carroll P., and belongs to the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church.

Franklin G. Wilson's birth occurred in Sumner County, Tenn., September 26, 1830, one of twelve children of Z. D. and K. K. (Stone) Wilson, and of English descent. The father was born in Bedford County in 1802, and after residing in different counties finally came to Obion County, where he resided until his death in the fall of 1880. The mother was born in Sumner County, and died at Lebanon in July, 1852, and was buried in the family cemetery on the farm on which she was born. At the age of twelve years our subject began learning the brick mason's trade, at which he worked until the beginning of the war. December 23, 1852, he married Amanda L. Hodges, daughter of Oakley Hodges. To them were born three children: Plummer M., born March 28, 1855, and died July 30, 1866; Laura F., born December 8, 1856, and Rebecca G., born December 6, 1858, and died August 25, 1868. Mrs. Wilson was born near Mount Pleasant, Maury Co., Tenn., October 29, 1833. Mr. Wilson was an old line Whig up to the late war, but

that time has affiliated with the Democratic party. He owns 195 acres of good land which he devotes to the raising of stock and the cereals, and is one of the prosperous farmers of the county. He and wife are members of the Methodist Episcopal Church South.

A. Wilson, merchant, of Obion Station, Tenn., and native of Obion County, was born on the 27th of February, 1859. His father, W. M. Wilson, was also born in Obion County, and resided here all his life. He was married to Nancy Ann Carothers, who was born in Giles County, Tenn. A. Wilson, our subject, was reared in Troy, Tenn., and when about twenty-two years of age came to Obion Station, and embarked in the grocery and drug business. He stands very high in the estimation of the people, and is scrupulously honest and exact in his business transactions. He is now worth about \$10,000, which he has partially made by his judicious management. He is a member in good standing in the Methodist Episcopal Church South, and is a Democrat and Prohibitionist in his political views. He received a good early education, and supports all enterprise for the advancement of educational institutions.

Rufus R. Winston, M. D., was born in Dresden, Weakley Co., Tenn., October 29, 1856, son of Peter and Penelope (Boyd) Winston, and of Scotch-English descent. Peter Winston was born in Hanover County, Va., and his wife was born in Boydsville, Tenn. The Winstons came to Tennessee as early as 1850, and both our subject's parents died in Fulton County, Ky. Rufus R. is the second of three children, and was raised on a farm. He first attended the common schools, and later spent two years at Cecilia College, in Hardin County, Ky. In 1871 he entered the University of Missouri, at Columbia, and there remained three years. He began the study of medicine in 1875, and first attended the medical department of the University of Missouri. He graduated from the University of Louisville, Ky., in the spring of 1877, and located at Dresden, and has practiced ever since. He came to Union City in 1884, and is one of the leading physicians of Obion County. He is a Democrat, and his first presidential vote was cast for Hancock. He is a member of the Christian Church, and was married, in 1879, to Anna L. Irvine, who was born December 24, 1856. They have two children: Willie A. and Annie C.

Frank M. Woody, merchant, was born in Maury County, October 11, 1857, and is one of six sons and two daughters of John N. and Martha J. (Caldwell) Woody, both of whom were natives of Maury County, their parents being among the pioneer settlers of that county. John N. Woody was a farmer, and died in 1884. His wife is still living in Maury County. Our subject remained with his parents until twenty years of age, and then worked for one year as a clerk in a store in Columbia, and then became a member of the firm of J. M. Hay & Co., continuing eighteen months. He then located at Palestine, Obion Co., Tenn., where he followed mercantile pursuits for three years, as one of the firm of R. & F. M. Woody. At the end of three years he accepted the position of traveling salesman for a Nashville wholesale boot and shoe firm, and still remains in their employ. December 9, 1880, he married Eugenia Johnson, and to their union one daughter has been born—May Belle. In 1882 Mr. Woody was elected magistrate of his district, and January, 1886, was elected chairman of the county court. He and wife are members of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

Rufus Woody, merchant of Palestine (P. O. Glass), Tenn., was born September 28, 1831, in Maury County, Tenn., and is one of eleven children, eight now living, born to the marriage of Robert Woody and Mary Ann Brooks, who were born in Orange County, N. C., and afterward moved to Maury County, Tenn. They both died in Maury County, in August, 1870. The father was a farmer and miller. At the age of twenty-six Rufus Woody began farming for himself, and continued that occupation three years. After coming to Obion County he farmed until 1863, and then joined the Second Tennessee Cavalry, and after the close of the war returned home, and continued farming until about 1870, then established a lumber and saw-mill in Palestine. This he afterward gave up, and in 1880 began merchandising in the same place, and his stock of goods amounts to about \$4,500. In September, 1857, he married Sarah E. Wells, who bore him seven children, all of whom are deceased except one daughter—Mary Ann. The family are mem-



from here to Alabama to marry his wife, and they rode horseback from near Huntsville, Ala., to this county. James J., our subject, was reared on a farm, and attended Bluff Springs Seminary, but finished his education at Howard College, Marion, Ala. In 1859 he began reading medicine, with Dr. W. R. Rooks, and in 1860 and 1861 attended lectures at the Nashville (now Vanderbilt) University. In May, 1861, he enlisted in Capt. E. H. Williams' company (known as the "Milan Greys"), Twelfth Regiment Tennessee Infantry, and served as second lieutenant. He was wounded at Shiloh, and discharged, and afterward joined Capt. Floyd's company of Mississippi cavalry, serving as private two years. He was detailed as a recruiting officer to West Tennessee, and organized Company H, of Maj. G. W. Bennett's battalion of Forrest's cavalry, and served as captain of the same until the company had so diminished in numbers as to be consolidated, when he was transferred to Gen. Kirby Smith's command, and served as a private until the surrender. In the fall of 1865 he entered the medical department of the University of Louisville, Ky., and graduated an M. D. in March, 1866. He practiced in Arkansas, and in 1867 returned to Tennessee, and practiced in Carroll County until 1873, then came to Milan, and has since had a lucrative practice in the city and vicinity. February 13, 1867, he married Harriet N. Miree, a native of Perry County, Ala. They have three children: James Hunter, Lena and Bessie. The Doctor is a Democrat, and a member of the Gibson County Medical Society, and is a Mason. He is an enterprising citizen, and is a medical practitioner of exceptional ability.

James M. Richmond, farmer and stock raiser of the Eleventh District of Gibson County, Tenn., is a native of Wilson County, born on the 15th of September, 1850, son of James P. and Caroline (Caraway) Richmond, Tennesseans by birth. James M.'s early days were spent on a farm, and his education obtained at Mount Vernon High School, in Wilson County. In 1867 he came to Weakley County and engaged in farming and clerking and remained there until 1874 when he moved to Missouri and there remained two years. He returned to Tennessee and located on his farm of 100 acres, where he now resides. The same is in a good state of cultivation, and the principal products are corn, wheat and cotton. Bettie Marshall became his wife on the 25th of July, 1879. She is a daughter of Frank and Mary E. Marshall, of Gibson County, and is the mother of three children: Mary M., Elizabeth and an infant daughter. Mrs. Richmond died May 10, 1883, and Mr. Richmond took for his second wife Nellie Marcum, daughter of Matthew and Sophronia Marcum, of Gibson County. Subject is a Democrat, and of Scotch-Irish descent.

William Riley is a North Carolinian, born in 1831, the son of Daniel and Margaret Riley, who were natives of the same State. They came to Gibson County, Tenn., about 1831, and engaged in agricultural pursuits. William spent his boyhood days on his father's farm and in acquiring an education in the common schools. He received no aid when starting in life for himself, but by energy and economy is the owner of 100 acres of land. He was married in 1842 to Mary Ormes, and to them were born seven children—five daughters and two sons—James W., Margaret E., Malinda K., Martha A., William T., Amanda and Mary F.

G. W. Robinson, a well and favorably known farmer residing near Yorkville, was born in Gibson County, Tenn., June 8, 1843, a son of Jefferson and Elizabeth Robinson, who were from North Carolina, and of German descent. He was reared to manhood on the farm and secured a fair education from the common schools of his native county. In 1862 he shouldered his musket in defense of the South, and served until the close of the war in the Thirteenth Tennessee Cavalry, commanded by Col. Wilson. In 1865 he embarked in agricultural pursuits on his own responsibility, and the same year took for his life's helpmate Miss Amelia K. Overall, who has borne him six children: Luther L., Willie J., Emma L., George E., Elizabeth and Walter F. All are living except Elizabeth. The parents are members of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. Mr. Robinson is a Democrat, a first-class citizen, is the owner of 350 acres of land, manufactures drain tile, operates a threshing machine and cotton-gins.

George W. Robinson is a son of James and Jane (Woodson) Robinson, who were born

in the Palmetto State in 1806 and 1807, respectively. They resided in their native State until 1834, when they moved to Tennessee and located in Gibson County, where the father farmed, followed carpentering, and later engaged in wagon-making. He was a Whig, and in the days of militia held the office of captain. His wife died in 1844, and he then lived with his children until 1875, when he, too, passed away. Their son, George W., was born in Union District, South Carolina, April 30, 1830. He resided on a farm, but received a limited education, owing to the undeveloped condition of the schools. He began working by the month for himself at the age of twenty-one, and in 1861 volunteered in Company E, Thirty-first Tennessee (Confederate) Infantry, and served about nine months. He then joined Forrest's command and continued until the close of the war. At Fort Pillow he received a severe wound from a grape-shot, disabling him for some time. After his return home he resumed farming and now owns 620 acres of land. In 1870 he married Mary T. Thetford, who was born in Gibson County, November 18, 1844. To them were born eight children. Mr. Robinson is a Democrat and a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church and his wife of the Christian Church.

H. W. Roberts, native of Henderson County, Tenn., was born December 15, 1835, son of Rev. John and Unity (Rogers) Roberts, who were born in North Carolina and of Irish and English descent, respectively. Rev. John Roberts came to West Tennessee in 1835, and was a Baptist minister of Henderson County until 1840, when his death occurred. His widow died in Weakley County, Tenn., in 1873. Our subject removed to Weakley County, Tenn., with his mother when but five years of age, and was there reared to manhood on a farm. He had little or no advantages for schooling until after attaining his majority, when he entered Hickory Grove Academy and attended school about twenty months. He then followed teaching for some time and remained at home with his mother during the war. He came to Humboldt in December, 1865, and began working at the carpenter's trade, which he followed for about five years. He then farmed and followed various occupations until 1875, when he engaged in the furniture business in connection with Z. T. Wright and continued the same three years. Since 1876 he has been justice of the peace and served as mayor of Humboldt during 1884 and 1885. He is a Democrat and Mason, and January 23, 1867, married Susie Vaughn, by whom he has three children: Horace, Fannie and John. The latter died May 4, 1886. Mrs. Roberts died September 10, 1879, and July 7, 1881, Mr. Roberts married Lucy Moore, daughter of John M. Moore. Mr. and Mrs. Roberts are members of the Missionary Baptist Church.

William Rosson, farmer, is a native of Marshall County, Tenn., born September 6, 1836, son of John and grandson of Joseph Rosson, who was born in North Carolina, and came to Tennessee at an early day, where he spent the remainder of his days. John Rosson was also born in North Carolina, in 1812, and came to Gibson County, Tenn., in 1850. He was married to Mary Robinson, who was born in Middle Tennessee, in 1816, and by her became the father of ten children. She died in 1880. Our subject is the eldest of the family, and was reared on a farm and educated in the common schools. At the age of twenty-one he became the architect of his own fortune, and in 1859 went to Wayne County, Ill., where he resided and farmed until 1881. He then returned to Gibson County, and in now resides one mile from Kenton in Gibson County. Mr. Rosson is a Democrat, and in 1860 married Frances A. Green, of Wayne County, Ill., born in 1843. To them were born three children: Michael C., born in 1841; John A. (deceased), and William Joseph, the youngest (deceased). Mr. and Mrs. Rosson belong to the Church of Latter Day Saints.

James M. Rogers, one of Gibson County's prominent farmers and stock raisers, was born in Trenton, Tenn., November 11, 1833. His parents, Obadiah and Sarah (Underwood) Rogers, were natives of Tennessee and North Carolina, respectively. The father was a cabinet-maker by trade and came to Gibson County when a mere lad, and for many years worked at his trade in Trenton. At the age of ten years our subject was taken to the country and was reared on a farm. In 1848 he and his parents located on his present farm of ninety-five acres of valuable land. He also owns another farm in the Eleventh District of Gibson County, and in his business ventures has met with merited success financially. In 1855 Emeline Marcum became his wife. She is a daughter of Henry and Mica

till 1835; then moved to Mississippi and farmed in Panola and Desoto Counties till 1845, when he returned to Gibson County, Tenn., locating five miles from Humboldt, where he remained until 1877; then purchased a one-half interest in the Gibson County Wells, and made that his summer home until 1881 (excepting one year spent at Eureka Springs, Ark.) He then purchased the remaining interest, and moved to the Wells. In October, 1837, he married Mary J. Seat, to whom one son and one daughter were born. The latter is deceased. The mother of these children died, and he then wedded V. Fulghum, and after her death wedded Belle Towns, his present wife. Mr. Williams is a member of the Baptist Church, and his wife of the Episcopal Church. The waters of the Gibson County Wells possess rare curative properties, and many almost miraculous cures are effected each season. They have been deservedly renowned for about forty years, and before the property was improved, hundreds of visitors would camp out in their vicinity during the summer season. The present proprietor, Mr. Williams, built a commodious hotel in addition to the cottages, and he and wife have made this an attractive summer home for many families throughout this and other States.

James C. Williams, junior member of the firm of J. D. Williams & Bro., is the second child of Charles and Clara C. (Young) Williams, who were born in Alabama and Kentucky, respectively. They both came to Gibson County, Tenn., when young and, after reaching years of maturity, married and raised a family of five children. The father was a member of the Missionary Baptist Church, a Democrat and farmer. He died in 1885, about sixty-seven years of age. The mother still resides on the old homestead which was settled by herself and husband when Bradford was a wilderness of woods. Her health is still good though she is nearly seventy years of age. James C. Williams was born in Gibson County October 15, 1840. When twenty years of age he married Virginia Blacett, who was born in 1844 and died in 1878, having borne seven children. In 1879 Mr. Williams married Millie Campbell, who was born in 1840, and became the mother of one daughter. In 1861 Mr. Williams joined Company G, Twelfth Tennessee Infantry, and remained with the same until the close of the war. From that time until the spring of 1886 he farmed, then joined his brother in the mercantile business in Bradford. In connection with this he also farms, his land amounting to 135 acres. He is a member of the Missionary Baptist Church and his wife is a Presbyterian.

Thomas J. Williams, chancery court clerk, was born in Chatham County, N. C., January 17, 1829, the youngest of eight children born to the marriage of Eli Williams and Chloe Collins. The former is of Welsh descent, born in Virginia and the latter is of Irish extraction and born in North Carolina. When Thomas J. was an infant of twelve months old his parents removed with him to Henderson County, Tenn., where he was reared a farmer's boy and received the advantages of the old field schools. After attaining his twenty-first birthday he began clerking in a country store, remaining three years, at which time he engaged in the business in company with his brothers, Wilson and Green, and continued four years. In the meantime Wilson Williams died. Thomas J. retired from the business January 1, 1858, and in the fall of that year began buying cotton and produce at Humboldt and the following spring began handling a line of general groceries in company with J. A. Shane, now of Memphis. This connection lasted one year. In February, 1862, Mr. Williams was appointed agent of the Louisville & Nashville Railroad (then known as the Mobile & Ohio) and held the position until the road was evacuated. In March, 1866, he took the same position and held it for two years. In June, 1869, he was appointed chancery court clerk at Humboldt and yet holds the position. He has been in the Democratic ranks. He is a member of the K. of H., K. & L. of H. and K. of G. R. November 11, 1852, Martha R. Cole became his wife. She was born October 2, 1832, daughter of Samuel F. and Olive (Walker) Cole, both of North Carolina and of Irish extraction. The following are the children born to Mr. and Mrs. Williams: Chippie, Wilson, Cora O., Florence (deceased), Samuel C. and Lily Pearl. Husband and wife are members of the Methodist Episcopal Church South.

Capt. E. H. Williams is a son of John and Susan (Fogg) Williams, born in Virginia,

in 1778 and 1786 respectively. The father was a farmer and school-teacher, and was married to Miss Fogg in Warren County, N. C., in 1815, and by her became the father of five children, two sons now living—our subject and his brother John, who is living in the Lone Star State. The father was a Democrat and died September 2, 1860. The mother died in 1848. Capt. E. H. Williams was born in Warren County, N. C., January 11, 1820, and was reared on a farm. He received a limited education, and in 1839 married Miss C. M. Sturdivant, who was born in Halifax County, N. C., January 27, 1822, and became the mother of five children, three of whom are living. In the fall of 1843 they moved to Carroll County, Tenn., and May 29, 1861, Mr. Williams joined the Twelfth Regiment, Tennessee Volunteers, Confederate States Army, and during three years service, rose to the rank of captain. In 1865 he came to Gibson County. His wife, who was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church South, died June 11, 1880. Capt. Williams then married, M. S. Caldwell, who was born in North Carolina, July 13, 1833. Mr. Williams is a Democrat and served as magistrate in this and Carroll Counties. He has been a merchant but is now a farmer and owns over 300 acres of fertile land. He and wife belong to the Methodist Episcopal Church South.

Nathan J. Williams is a son of Johnson and Elizabeth (Robb) Williams, who were born in Tennessee. The father in early life learned the blacksmith trade and followed it for a number of years, making a success of the same financially. For some years previous to the war, slaves carried on the work, but were superintended by him. He served as constable and sheriff, and during the Rebellion was with the Union, yet sympathized with the Southerners. After the death of the Whig party he was a Democrat. He was the first sheriff of Gibson County after the war, being elected in 1870. He made his home in Trenton and was an excellent citizen and honest man. He died in 1884. His wife died in 1833. Nathan J., our subject, is one of six children and was born in Gibson County, in 1849. He was reared in Trenton and lived with his father until 1882, when he married Hattie L. Smith, daughter of W. L. and Ann L. (Hall) Smith. She was born in this State in 1858, and is the mother of two children: Earl H. and Gordon L. Mr. Williams owns about fifty-five acres of land a mile and a half from the county seat, and seventy-two acres nearer town. He also has an interest in fifty-one acres in another portion of the county. He has been constable in his district, and served as deputy sheriff under his father a number of years. He is a Democrat, and of Irish and English descent, and his family have always been noted for their honor and integrity.

William H. Wilson, general merchant, was born in Gibson County, August 2, 1843, son of James and Harriett (Wilkes) Wilson, and of Scotch-Irish descent. The parents were born in Middle Tennessee in 1816 and 1821, and died in 1858 and 1854, respectively. The paternal grandfather was James Wilson, a North Carolinian and a son of James Wilk. The family came to Tennessee, one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence. The family came to Tennessee as early as 1810, and to Gibson County in 1836. Our subject is the fourth of six children, and was educated in the common schools. In 1861 he joined Company T, Twelfth Tennessee Infantry, Confederate States Army, but on account of ill health only served about one year. In 1869 he engaged in the saddlery business in Kenton, but at the end of one year discontinued this and engaged in the grocery business, putting in a general stock in 1874. The same year he formed a partnership in the mercantile business with Henry Flowers, Jr., and Mr. Wilson has since continued. He was married, in January, 1865, to Miss N. B. Porter, who was born in Gibson County in 1844. They have one child, Dora H. Mrs. Wilson died in 1867, and in 1871 Mr. Wilson wedded Miss N. B. Crane, who died in 1875. He again married in 1877 and is the father of two children: Clara H. and Cleveland A. Mr. Wilson is a Democrat and Mason, and his wife belongs to the Methodist Episcopal Church.

M. S. Wilkes' birth occurred in 1821. His parents, John and Polly (Halliburton) Wilkes, were born in Virginia and Tennessee, respectively. The father was brought to Tennessee when quite young, and became a moderately prosperous farmer. He was a Whig and served as magistrate a number of years. He came to Gibson County in 1836 and died in 1873. He served in the Creek war under Jackson, and he and wife were mem-
